Medical Criteria: Ski Camp

While we can safely support the majority of camper conditions, we need up-to-date health information on every camper, to review their medical and social needs prior to acceptance to camp. Here are some general rules of thumb:

Siblings or Bereaved Siblings

- Immunizations are up-to-date if possible
- Well (no colds, flu, or communicable diseases) at the time of camper check-in
- Physical and social needs cleared by camp medical staff and camp director
- Medical conditions such as diabetes, seizures, asthma, bleeding/clotting disorders, and allergies with anaphylactic reactions are divulged and a plan is made around how to care for the camper at camp.
- Medical routines for catheters, insulin injections, port care, etc. are discussed with our medical team and they confirm that we can safely administer.
- Social/developmental conditions or challenges are shared and discussed to ensure we have the skills/staffing to successfully serve your child at camp.
